- Important Information for Foreign Residents THERE WILL BE CHANGES IN NOTIFICATION FILING PROCEDURES DUE TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF NEW RESIDENCY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

A new residency management system for foreign residents will go into effect on July 9th 2012, and the current Alien Registration System will be abolished accordingly. In the new system, foreign nationals residing legally in Japan for the mid- to long-term period will become subject to the Basic Resident Registration Law (*exceptions apply to those under specified condition), and their basic personal information, information of residence and resident status will be managed under Basic Resident Registration System (住民基本台帳). Foreign residents will also become able to obtain a copy of the certificate of residence (住民票) at municipal office, just as for Japanese nationals.

In accordance with the implementation of new system, there will be changes in the procedural system for filing notifications regarding any changes of the registered information as explained in the followings.

< Resident Card 在留カード >

In the new residency management system, mid- to long-term foreign residents will be issued a Resident Card (*Zairyuu* Card). They need to keep their current Alien Registration Certificates until a Resident Card is issued. They will be asked to exchange their Alien Registration Certificates for a Resident Card when filing an application or notifications involving the issue of a new Resident Card at a regional immigration office, or can exchange the certificate for a card at their own request after the implementation of new system.

< Filing a notification pertaining to place of residence >

In the current system, when a foreign resident moves out to another municipality, filing of Moving-out Notice (転出届) was not required but just needed to file a Moving-in Notice (転入届) to the municipality of new domicile. Please note that new system requires filing of both above mentioned notices. Moving-in Notice will not be accepted without the attachment of Moving-out Certificate issued by the municipal office of former domicile and presentation of identification(s) certifying the applicant's legal resident status.

< Filing a notification pertaining to an item other than the place of residence >

In the new residency management system, change of resident status, extension of the period of residence or change to items of basic personal information (name, date of birth, gender, nationality/region) need not be reported to the municipality of domicile. Please file notifications pertaining to the any change of registered information other than the resident address at the regional immigration office only.

* Reporting the change of resident status or basic personal information may be required for some insurance subscription and public allowance registration. Please confirm with the relevant offices for procedure requirements.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE WILL BECOME AVAILABLE FOR MID-TERM RESIDENTS

After the implementation of new residency management system on July 9th 2012, mid-term foreign residents (who stay in Japan longer than 3 months up to 1 year) will newly become eligible for subscribing to National Health Insurance (*Kokumin Kenkou Hoken*) which is designed for the general public other than those who are employed and covered by any other health insurance, seamen's insurance or mutual aid association plans. PAPER TRASH & CLOTH WASTE COLLECTION on RAINY DAY

- Paper Trash (newspaper, commercial bill, magazine, cardboard, book, miscellaneous paper, etc.)
 Wet paper trash can be recycled. Please put it out for collection at the usual spot even in a rainy morning, so the collection workers can easily find it. No need for placing it under the eaves. It is best to use a pulp twine to tie up the paper trash for the processing efficiency.
- Cloth Waste (used clothing, old linen, etc.)

Wet cloth kind materials can <u>not</u> be recycled. Bagged cloth waste might get wet during the collection work. If it rains on the designated collection day for cloth kind waste, do not try to dispose of it, just put it out on the next designated collection day. Shoes, bags, and other items made with the combination of cloth fabric and metal/rubber/leather parts must be disposed as burnable trash.

* Used underwear, sock and heavily soiled cloth can not be recycled → Burnable Trash.

Tomin Juutaku is managed by Tokyo Metropolitan Government and offered to rent to middle-income earners raising children in purpose of providing affordable housings for them with the partially subsidized rent. Applications for *Tomin Juutaku* housings are handled by *Toukyouto Juutaku Kyoukyuu Kousha* (JKK Tokyo). The application brochures of the current offer term will be available from June 4th (Mon) to 13th (Wed) at *Kenchiku-ka* in city hall 2nd floor (8:30AM~5PM), at city hall branch offices (9AM~1PM weekdays only), and at city hall Main Reception on the weekend. <u>Eligibility</u>: Applicant must be currently residing in Tokyo metropolitan area, whose income meets the designated range, and needing a house for him/herself with family, etc.

FY2012 RESIDENTS TAX PAYMENT will start in JUNE

FY2012 Residents Tax Notification (市民税·都民税 納税通知書) will be mailed to the tax payers of the ordinary collection method in early June. As for the tax payers applicable to the special collection method, the tax detail will be notified from their employer.

* Residents Tax amount is calculated based on the income of preceding calendar year. It must be paid in four installments through a year with Ordinary Collection, or in six installments with Special Collection.

◆ Regulation Changes for FY2012 ◆

- Tax exemption system for dependents under age 16 was abolished, and the amount of tax exemption for dependents at age 16~18 was reduced from ¥450,000(previous) to ¥330,000.
- In *Nishitama* area, including *Hamura* City, the municipal administrations are encouraging Special Collection Method among its' residents. Due to this policy, some people's Residents Tax collection method may have been changed from Ordinary Collection to Special Collection. Please confirm your payment method.

Ordinary Collection

If your Resident Tax is not deducted from your salary/wage, or if you are self-employed, you will receive a Resident Tax Notification from the city office in early June. In this method you must pay Resident Tax in four installments (June, August, October and January). Please confirm your tax notification details, and make sure that your tax payments are not delayed.

With the payment slips enclosed in the notification, you can pay your Residents Tax at city hall, banks, post offices and designated convenience stores (listed on the back of notification) or by bank transfers.

If your slips are lost, please have them reissued at Kazei-ka Shiminzei-kakari in city hall.

*A payment over ¥300,000 and a payment slip without barcode are not accepted at convenience stores.

Special Collection

If you are employed, your Residents Tax is usually withheld every month from your salary/wage, beginning in June and ending in May of the succeeding year. The monthly withholding amount is to be notified from your employer before the withholding starts.

- * With payment method of Special Collection From Public Pension, the tax will be deducted in 6 installments.
- * For those under age 65 (as of January 1_{st}, 2012) who have income from both employment and public pension, Residents Tax is, in principal, deducted from the employment earning in Special Collection method.

If any of the following cases apply to you, please file a report of change of property condition.

Real Estate Value Inspection

If you newly build a residence or expand the existing property in FY2012, you need to have your taxable residence value (re)evaluated for the taxation purpose. Please contact *Kazei-ka Koteishisanzei-kakari* and set up an appointment for *Kaoku Chousa* (Real Estate Value Inspection).

Report of Demolished Property

If you have a registered property or part of such property demolished within the year of 2011, please file a Lost Property Registration (*Messhitsu Touki*). In a case of demolishing an unregistered property, please also file a report, otherwise, property tax will continue to be levied on the demolished (non-existing) property.

Residential Land Property

If you have any of the following cases regarding your land property in FY2012, please file a required report.

- Change the use purpose (residential/commercial) of land property due to building a new house on the site
- Had existing house demolished, and changed the use purpose of land property.
- Built a business property within the (former) residential land property
- Changed a residential real estate property to a commercial real estate

FY2011 DIOXINS ANALYSIS for AIR and FLUE GAS

Report from Nishitama Sanitary Association Environment Management Center

Dioxins analysis for the flue gas output from *Nishitama* Sanitary Association Environment Management Center (our local waste management facility) and for the air of the facility's neighborhood area were conducted 8 times during FY2011. The analysis results showed that dioxins levels in the tested flue gas and air well satisfies the safety standard level regulated by The Environmental Air-Quality Standard, and The National Regulation for Dioxins and The Pollution Control Agreement Regulation.

A checkup report of Specified Health Checkups will help you establish your personal health guideline.

This medical examination program with a particular focus on the detection and treatment of lifestyle diseases, especially metabolic syndrome, is carried out by medical insurance providers to the subscribers and their dependents who become age 40 or older between April 2012 ~ March 2013.

Specific Health Checkups Notification and Tickets (健康診査受診券) were mailed out by *Hamura* City to National Health Insurance subscribers at applicable age and Late-Elderly Medical Insurance subscribers in late May. Individuals who are subscribed to Welfare Annuity, Mutual Aid Association or company health insurance union should receive the tickets from their health insurance provider or employer.

Checkup Ticket Validity: June 1st (Fri) ~ October 31st (Wed)

Items to Bring: Specific Health Checkups Ticket, Medical Insurance Certificate(Card)

*High volume of checkup appointment request is expected later in the ticket validity period. Please try to have a checkup done at your earliest convenience.

*Metabolic Syndrome * メタボリックシンドロームとは

This syndrome is identified as the presence of two or more of the metabolism risk factors such as high blood-sugar, high blood-pressure, dyslipidemia (blood fat disorders) and etc, in addition to abdominal obesity. This condition may lead to health complications with high risk of cardiac or cerebral infarction.

< Healthcare Guidance > 特定保健指導

As part of this medical examination program targeting lifestyle diseases, Post-Checkup Counseling is provided for individuals concerned to be "at risk" of lifestyle disease. Certified Nurse and Dietitian will provide advises on personal bases for resolving the risk-making lifestyle, with a particular focus on avoiding the Metabolic Syndrome. The counseling is free of charge.

- ① Those who turn(ed) age 40 or older in FY2012 and have never taken Hepatitis Screening before.
- 2 Those who had a health check-up this year and their hepatic function rate was abnormal.
