# **Earthquakes**



Earthquakes are common in Japan. Earthquakes cause many dangers such as toppled furniture and broken windows.

#### When you feel a tremor

- with a sturdy object)
- ⚠ Do not panic and go outside (objects may fall on your head)






#### When the shaking stops

- (open doors)




⚠ If there is smoke, cover your mouth and nose with a handkerchief or the like



 ∧ Beware of aftershocks (smaller earthquakes after large earthquakes) If it is dangerous inside, evacuate

Where to evacuate to

...Large parks, schoolyards, etc.

Anvone can use a shelter. but prepare necessary items by yourselves.

When evacuating, close the gas valve in your house and turn off the electric breaker.



### **Heavy rain and typhoons**

Heavy rain and typhoons are common from June through October.



Heavy rain can cause rivers to overflow and water to enter homes.

Strong winds may cause objects to fly or trees to fall.

If it is not safe to go outside, escape to a place higher than the second floor.

#### When should I evacuate for heavy rain or typhoons?

Evacuate to a safe place once evacuation warnings are issued through televisions and the like.

→ Those that require time to evacuate must do so.




### Where are shelters located?

#### What should I prepare?

When a disaster occurs, your electricity, gas, and water may be shut off.

You will not be able to purchase food or beverages at supermarkets or convenience stores.

→ You must make preparations at home.





Make sure to prepare enough supplies (3 days-worth) for the family that you can easily take with you when evacuating.

#### **Example of emergency** supplies

- Food and water
- Flashlight
- Disposable toilets
- Passports, residence cards
- Chargers, portable power supplies
- Masks, wet wipes
- Clothing, underwear
- Medicine, first-aid kit
- Cash (coins), valuables

If you have a baby or small child, also prepare diapers and baby formula. It is also useful to prepare pre-packaged foods (those you can heat up) and canned foods.

#### To avoid injuries

To avoid injuries, use topple prevention products for furniture and shatterproof film for windows.





#### Participate in disaster prevention drills

Various drills that consist of evacuating to a shelter. extinguishing a fire and the like are conducted to prepare \_\_\_\_ residents for a disaster.



#### **Contact methods** during disasters

When a disaster strikes and phonelines are crowded, use the Disaster Message Dial, which allows you to record and listen to messages.

- ① Dial 171
- To record a ② Press 1 message
  - 3 Enter your own phone number
  - 4 Record your message



- ① Dial 171
- 2 Press 2
- To listen a message
- 3 Enter your family/friend's phone number
- 4 Listen to the message

#### Points to note at a shelter

Everyone helps each other while staying in a shelter.



Do not enter or peek into other people's spaces, or talk loudly. Everyone must follow the rules.

If you see an elderly person, a person with a disability, or a person with a baby in need, help them.



Greet and talk with your neighbors on a daily basis.

When a disaster occurs, ambulances and fire engines cannot arrive immediately.

It is important to cooperate with your neighbors and help each other.

Start by saying "Konnichiwa (Hello)!"
